WHAT IS PROGRAM FOR ADVANCED COLLEGE CREDIT (PACC)?

The Program for Advanced College Credit (PACC) provides unique learning opportunities by offering college courses taught in your high school. These varied classes hold the same expectations, workload, learning activities, projects, and exams as college courses. Saint Mary's University faculty work closely with approved high school faculty to ensure that the courses are being taught as they would at Saint Mary's.

PACC supports its partner schools through ongoing educational opportunities based on university standards.

BENEFITS OF PACC

- Take college courses while still in high school.
- Save money on college tuition.
- Attain part-time Saint Mary's University student status.
- Receive scholarships (available for PACC students who choose to continue their education at Saint Mary's University).

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Have at least a 'B' average.
- Score in the 50th percentile or higher on a standardized test.
- Obtain teacher and/or administrator approval.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

- Each PACC credit is \$75 (a 3-credit course will cost \$225; a 4-credit course costs \$300).
- Courses must be paid in full at the beginning of each semester.
- A \$15 late fee will be applied to registrations postmarked after deadline.
- Make checks payable to your high school, NOT Saint Mary's University.
- All checks and registration materials should be returned to the high school by the established deadline.
- If you withdraw from classes after 10 business days, NO refunds will be given.

REGISTRATION

- See your high school PACC representative for a list of courses offered through PACC.
- Registration materials should be returned to the high school by the established deadline.
- Find registration materials at smumn.edu/pacc, or your high school PACC representative can also provide them.

TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS AND GRADING

- Transcript requests can be made at smumn.edu/pacc.
- Grades will be granted by your course instructor based on Saint Mary’s University criteria.
- Grades will be entered as part of your Saint Mary’s University transcript.

TRANSFER CREDITS

- Credit recognition remains the exclusive prerogative of the institution granting it.
- Check with the institution of your choice for acceptance policies, as they can and do change.
- Course descriptions available on our website are frequently used by colleges to determine how to accept the credits.

PACC IN A NUTSHELL ...

- PACC is among the first private concurrent enrollment programs in Minnesota. It was established in 1986 in accordance with Saint Mary's Lasallian mission to provide private high school students with accessible higher education opportunities
- Qualified students can earn college credit while taking rigorous courses from credentialed teachers in the familiarity of their own high schools.
- PACC students can save thousands of dollars as they accumulate college credits before even graduating from high school.
- PACC makes it possible for students to get an idea of what full-time college coursework will be like before they leave the comfort of home, resulting in a more seamless transition from high school to college.
- Students are able to complete numerous general education courses through PACC, freeing them to focus more on their areas of academic interest and/or extracurricular activities once they enroll in college.
- Completing even a single PACC course puts high school students ahead of incoming college freshmen, giving them an edge in such things as registering for college classes.
- PACC helps students avoid the duplication of courses taken in high school and in college.
- Unlike those who take an AP exam, PACC students are guaranteed college credit when they earn a C or better.
- PACC students are provided with access to campus resources.
